	Elkhart ISD is a rural, low economic district with 1204 students and is located in an area with no economic benefits/job trades to lure families here. We have had an increase in vacancies of staff members, losing them to the neighboring schools which are able to pay more, so our retention rate has suffered. Our district will benefit with a Grow Your Own program in that it will offer a way to help with the needs of our district and will build a pool of staff members needed to fill vacant positions. Putting time, effort, and money into our local students will hopefully create a selection of future teachers who will stay with our district.

The Director of Curriculum and Instruction is an existing position, and will lead the project, along with the C.T.E. Coordinator and the high school principal. The Director of Curriculum and Instruction oversees all 4 campuses of our district, consults with teachers in their choices of curriculum and instruction, and maintains close contact with each principal to help our beginning and/or struggling teachers become successful. Our C.T.E. Coordinator is a new position which is going to be in place for the new school year, 2025-2026. This teacher has a master's degree and has prior experience as a coordinator for C.T.E. in another district. She will be responsible for the work involving the students and the staff teaching the required classes, ensuring success of the grant funds being used. Another teacher /leader who will be involved in the instruction of the students for these classes has taught for over 10 years, has a master's degree, and teaches Principles of Education courses presently. We have an Assistant Principal at the high school with over 5 years of experience in that position, and 10 years in teaching, and our High School principal, who has been in that position for 8 years. The Director of Federal and Special Programs has over 35 years of experience in teaching and administration, with 6 years' experience in her present position.

The major goal of this program for Elkhart ISD is to create more interest in teaching, and targeting our high school students so that recruitment of these students will equip us with the teachers we need in the future. We hope to address shortage areas, which include special education, and hopefully demonstrate the benefits of that area of teaching through our collaboration with Trinity Valley Community College. The program will consist of high quality courses which will develop their skills in teaching, hopefully securing those students in their resolve to return to Elkhart ISD for their future teaching career. We hope to offer this program as a dual credit program, furthering the interests of students to turn to teaching as a career. The activities and strategies implemented will be to collaborate with our local community college and align the course curricula with high standards, make certain that the high school educators meet the necessary credentials to teach dual credit courses, and have professional development to align instructional strategies with college-level requirements. The district will have an advisory committee with representatives from various organizations to oversee curriculum and program alignment. Students enrolled will be partnered with elementary or middle school students to help in the classrooms and hopefully have the high school students pair and observe teachers in managing classrooms and teaching diverse learners. We hope to demonstrate

how policies and practices are created within the school district, expose the students to school board meetings, and how things work federally, state-wide, and locally within a school system.

D. Performance and Evaluation Measures

Performance measures for our goal of securing students' interests in the program will include attendance and participation rates, learning outcomes, and surveys to measure interest levels and teaching effectiveness of the instructors. Monitoring success will include tracking performances across subjects, and evaluating improvements in the students' performance. Student scores from their E&T classes will be evaluated for growth, also. Tracking the students' enrollment in these courses and using self assessments to evaluate their own growth will also be used. Tracking any professional development taken, along with scheduled meetings with an advisory meeting for monitoring the curriculum and alignment will provide useful information, making certain that the credentials are met by both the teaching staff as well as the students. The program will also assess using structured classroom observations when paired with elementary students to assess the students' progress as they work with younger students. Meetings will be scheduled with the advisory team quarterly to go over the information gathered, and decisions will be made according to data collected in order to improve the program if needed.

To meet the needs and goals of this program, Elkhart ISD will address the need for a teacher pipeline within the 2-year timeline by providing students with a pathway, including college credit, and certifications aligned to the grant's requirements. The stipends the grant will offer will award our staff in this program and will help our students participate in the CTSO events, as well as hopefully create an interest and love of teaching.

- A. Stipends will be needed to pay for the Education and Training dual credit teacher over a 2-year timeline, beginning in 2025, which will be \$11,000 for 2 years, which is \$5500 per year, and \$2,000 will be given to the Education and Training field site teacher, divided by 2, equaling \$1000 per year. One non-dual credit teaching stipend will cost \$5500 for 2 years, equaling \$2750 per year.
- B. Implementation costs of \$5,000 for 2 years at \$2500 per year will include CTSO conference participation, membership fees, and travel costs.
- c. Additional costs related to student transportation to and from Education and Training field sites for Instructional Practices and/or Practicum courses, substitute
 coverage for teachers to attend CTSO events, dual credit costs, CTSO event/conference participation, membership fees, and travel costs d. Administrative and/or

We will set aside substitute teacher money at \$500 per year for two years, equaling \$1,000. Because this is the beginning year for dual credit E and T classes, we will use \$2000 for two years as an additional funding for other costs acquired for implementing the program.

Our new CTE coordinator and principal will make quarterly check-in's to see how the goals are being reached and the progress made. If any weaknesses in any areas are seen, training will be provided.

Monitoring will be done by the CTE coordinator and principal with check-ins quarterly at the minimum. EISD will prominently "market" the program, hopefully drawing the attention needed for an increase in recruitment and retention. An evaluation and feedback system will help promote the needs and accomplishments of the program, hopefully creating success stories to demonstrate the impact of this program, creating a future plan and pipeline for our next wave of future teachers.




