McDade ISD has the following goals as our District and Secondary Improvement Plans

- 1.3 Increase access to new and varied College/Career/Military(CCMR) opportunities.
- 1.3.1 Connect with community partners to bridge academic content to real world application (i.e. apprenticeships, internships, practicums, etc.)
- 1.3.2 Pursue partnership/MOU's with neighboring districts and colleges for access to expanded CTE options/pathways.
- 1.3.3 Investigate scheduling options to accommodate

This CTE grant would help us meet all of these goals we set for our district and campus. We are small rural school with a total of 171 students 7<sup>th</sup> – 12<sup>th</sup> grade and working diligently to provide post-secondary exposure, skills and partnerships to improve a successful transition from academic settings to real world workforce applications. McDade ISD is in the planning stages with Austin Community College, ACC, to offer CTE dual credit for next year. We are also partnering with ACC to provide exposure to ACC's CTE offerings in Elgin, Austin, Buda and Smithville. This will allow McDade ISD to gain access to education and resources we do not have access to on a daily basis.

### Summary of Program (Focus Area 1)

All incoming 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> graders will be offered the opportunity to accelerate their learning by completing a summer course that offers exposure to various careers that are in high demand near the McDade / Travis County communities that are within 10 to 30 miles from the McDade community. Professionals will be brought in as guest speakers and students will visit Austin Community Colleges in Elgin, Austin Highland and Buda to tour CTE offering work spaces. In addition to that McDade has an MOU with Workforce Solutions who will help provide opportunities for students to experience varied skill sets and what professions are connected to certifications offered through TEA CTE certification offerings. McDade students currently enrolled in Animal Science Pathways will have the opportunity to partner with. This class will be taught by a certified teacher, alternatively certified teacher or and individual who has direct experience and access to the highly employable CTE jobs located in the Central Texas area.

## Summary of Program (Focus Area 2)

Austin Community College - Elgin, in their Vet Tech program and will work with area Veterinarians as assistants for real world connections to class work from this previous semester as well as areas in the Health care services field. McDade does not have the resources to provide virtual labs or invest in current technology to provide up to date training for these students. This CTE grant will allow us to provide transportation to additional learning as well as pay students for their time to work with Veterinarians who have an expressed interest in our students if we secure this grant. This grant can provide opportunities that we do not have the local resource or time to work into the high school schedule. This course will be designed with our Ag / Health Science Teacher, administration and high school counselor.

Their intership leader will provide verbal and written communications on areas to address in the class setting that would improve their performance. Skills assessment sheets will be made for the purpose of acquisition and will be assessed by the employer and the class room teacher with on the job application assessment. McDade ISD will track the enrollment in the Ag Animal Science and in Health Related services. This will help us determine the success of the program and needs to continue to work and develop community partner relationships as to how they are positively impacting students and their post-secondary opportunities. We will be tracking how many of the students apply and participate in our work study program offered to juniors and seniors who are on track to graduate.

We currently are only able to offer this class for two periods during the secondary schedule which consists of grades 7 - 12. Students are mixed grade levels and not all students who would like to take this class are able due to other required courses for graduation and availablilty of classes due to lack of local funds, space, and teacher availability.

As McDade High School is a relatively new high school, 7 years old, we are working on developing programs that contribute to the interest of our students paired with employability. Agriculture in animal science is one of our most developed pathways for students currently and is growing rapidly. We are seeking out support for these students so they have increased opportunities to practice and engage in meaningful intentional ways. Experience with equipment and professional coaching is essential for their understanding. We currently employ two Ag teachers at McDade that are working constantly to grow their program. This grant will help us to support their efforts. Our current Ag program has a total budget of \$5,000 a year, not including teacher salaries. The level of engagement of this course offers time off of campus and purposeful developments of partnerships and MOU's that can aid in the support of the development of the future of our program.

Our school district is hindered by budget, space and scheduling opportunities for students. Pathway classes must compete with other required classes for graduation. In smaller rural districts like ours it is difficult for us to make these classes accessible due to the cost of equipment and lack of businesses in our immediate area. We are currently trying to grow our CTE offerings with Austin Community College - Elgin campus. This campus does have Vet Tech classes and are willing to partner with McDade to help them develop there CTE dual credit class. This is a unique opportunity for us and available because of the interest of our students and the manageability of potential class size. Some of these students are already volunteering for experience at area vet clinics that are willing to enter into and MOU agreement for curriculum and evaluation if we secure this grant. The grant will help us provide transportation to the vet clinics and pay the student to work there. In addition we will be able to design a class that meets the need of the pathway and the student will receive credit for class completion as determined by the instructor and employer combined.
