Transportation also proves to be a challenge during the school year. Many students do not have their own transportation to get to and from work-based learning opportunities during the school day. With the 90 minute time frame, parents/guardians often cannot pick up students, take them to off site locations and turn around and pick them up and return them to school, especially with many of them working themself. However, during the CTE Summer Internship Program, parents/guardians are able to take students in the morning on their way to work and pick them up later in the afternoon. Summer allows students to work longer shifts than the 90 minute class period, making transportation easier to work out.

The CTE Summer Internship Program has been instrumental in providing work-based learning opportunities to both students and businesses that would normally not have the chance to participate.
